

Boundaries Map



Our cultural district encompasses the historic district of downtown Wabash, which is bounded by the railroad on the North and the Wabash River on the South. We refer to this as our "Rails to River". This district was established in 1986. The Cultural district starts as you enter Wabash from the South through the famous man made "cut" through limestone on the Indiana Highway 13/15 Corridor. Turn right (East) on Canal Street, then North on Allen Street to include Paradise Spring Historical Park. The district turns West on Market Street and intersects back with Highway 13 (Wabash Street), turning right (North) to the railroad. Turn left (West) and following Hill Street, the North most street bordering the railroad. Continue West on Hill Street to Cass Street. Turning left (South) travel to Market Street where you will turn right (WEST). This takes you by the Honeywell Center. Turn left (South) on Carroll Street, south to Smith St. Turning left (East) returning to the Wabash Street/Highway 13/15 corridor. The Wabash River is a natural southern border of the district. We have wayfinding signs throughout the community that list many options located in the Cultural district, as well as we have a Historical Downtown Boundary Map.
